Health & Wellness Survey Insights:

in-person survey Spring 2024, n=4,567

Students are having sex.

65%

Have had oral sex

63%

Have had vaginal sex

15%

Have had anal sex

38%

Rarely or never use a condom (among sexually active)

16%

Have had 3-5 vaginal/anal sexual partners since August 2023

70%

Have NOT been STI tested within the last year (among sexually active)

What is Free Condom Friday (FCF)?

A program that provides a variety of free safer sex materials and sexual health education resources to reduce the risk of Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) and unintended pregnancies

- Every Friday from 12-2pm during the academic year in front of Campus Health
- Staffed by senior public health interns

We distribute:



External condoms



Internal condoms



Lube



Latex dams (flavored)



Gloves

Students attended FCF

Free Condom Friday Survey Insights:

in-person survey Spring 2024, n=39



Free Condom Friday makes students more likely to use a condom during sex.

100%

said that because of FCF, they were more likely to use a condom

72%

said they would be less likely to use a condom if FCF wasn't available

95%

said they felt comfortable getting condoms at FCF



100%

would recommend FCF to a friend

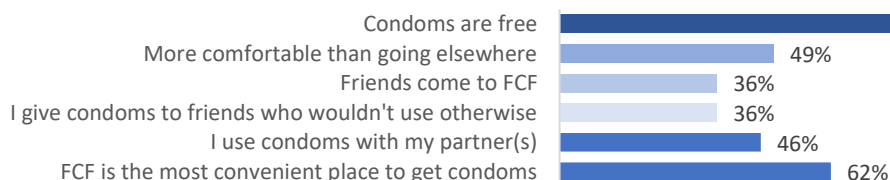
