Sexual Health Quick Look




Undergraduate Health and Wellness Survey 2024 (N= 4,567)

Key Insights:

- 63% of students have been sexually active since August 2023.
- **31%** of students reported **never** having **any** type of sex.
- 70% of students have not been tested for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) within the last year (among sexually active).
- 26% of students use some form of birth control other than condoms. Popular forms of birth control include oral contraceptive pills and intrauterine devices.
- **43% of female identifying** students use a form of hormonal birth control.
