IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT



<u>Due to periodic outbreaks of Measles and Mumps throughout the United States</u>, we require that all new incoming students have two documented doses of the MMR vaccine. You will not be permitted to enroll in or drop classes without proof of immunity against Measles and Mumps (MMR) on file with the UA Campus Health Service.

The University of Arizona policy requires the following from all incoming and transfer students: Proof of immunity to measles and mumps by one of the following:

- Two (2) MMR immunizations with the first given at or after 1 year of age and the second given at least 28 days apart from the first, OR
- A lab test that shows antibody immunity to measles and mumps
- The immunization requirement is waived if you were born before January 1, 1957.
